 - **Governance** (e.g. who is involved in what decisions)
 - Finance (e.g. how are resources obtained and allocated)

LONESTARP3 Research Collaboratives

Research Collaboratives will include a minimum of two RP3 Members to work collectively to investigate the research questions from our shared Pathways Research Agenda.

Collaborative members will be selected based on their:

- local communities' expressed interest in the problem of practice
- access to the target population and demographics
- expertise on the topic and necessary research methods
- their capacity to **complete agile investigations** that surface meaningful insights in 12-18 months.

Processes

Statement of Work

Short, compelling launching point that **reflects our Research agenda**, **includes members and community partners**, and provides **rapid and responsive r**esults.

Content

- Leads/CoLeads and their qualifications
- Contributing Researchers, their qualifications, and their
 Member Affiliation
- (High potential) Community Partners
 - Size/scope using enrollment or metric relevant to study design
 - Demographics
- Research strand and selected questions
- Methods and Metrics, and timeline for formative and "final" findings over 12-18 months
- Current or planned work to leverage

Budget and Budget Narrative


We have nearly \$900,000 to award and anticipate variation in size and scope of awards. Collaboratives will have the opportunity to renew for a second year.

Expenses

- **Lead** (or CoLeads): Not to exceed 0.25 FTE (or equivalent in summer months or course release)
- Contributing Researchers: What is needed, not all who are interested
- Data acquisition and analysis costs
- Participant costs
 - Collaboration costs food, travel, parking, facilities, etc.
 - Liaison/Point of Contact costs
 - Incentive costs
- Indirect costs: 10%

All the Messy Details

aka the fine print

- The proposed **guidelines are the "norm", we expect variation** and will work with Leads to provide the flexibility needed for each Collaborative.
- While all Members may not directly be involved in all studies, all Members do have voice in study designs.
- While we have a unified timeline January to January all Collaboratives need not form, launch and finish in unison.
- The Pathways Research Agenda should serve as a guide; conversations between researchers and community partners may lead to revisions that differ from the published questions but still honor the broader intention.
- While core research designs will be common across sites, some variation in design to meet local partner needs is anticipated.
- Budgets will be allocated based on our collective view of the relative priority of each strand as expressed by community partners and the policy landscape, and the size and scope of the investigations required to generate meaningful insights.
- Funds will be allocated as **contracts or subawards to each Member institution** for their contributions across all Collaboratives.
- Not all Collaboratives or all investigations will thrive; We are innovating and learning; anticipate some failure.
