De-Identified Individual Data

- The data housed in the ERC contain educational records and personal information about students, educators, and employees in Texas that is considered confidential and protected by FERPA regulations.
- This data can be linked longitudinally at the individual level across different datasets due to its integrated nature, using <u>alternative</u> <u>identifiers</u> that matches consistently across agency data.
- The ERC goal is to protect individuals under FERPA while simultaneously providing access and support to researchers.

1. Supplemental Data - Example

- We can use the ERC data system to determine the impact of an intervention by flagging the participants (treatment group).
- The treatment group PII data is sent securely to TEA. TEA will match the external data to the PII data they have on all PK-12 public school students and employees of Texas Public schools.
- To have the most number of accurate matches, TEA would like to have: social security number (SSN) or state assigned id, first name, last name, and date of birth. If SSN is not available, including the high school the student attends or which school the student graduated, and student's high school graduation year will assist in increased record matching.



2. Supplemental Data - Example

 The THECB will match the students who are enrolled in higher education in Texas.

The next step is the de-identification process.

 They create an "age-as-of-September-1" and create an alternative ID1 and/or ID2, delete the name, DOB, and SSN or state assigned id. The de-identified data is securely transferred to the ERC.



ERC Procedures for Data Access – 9 steps

- 1. Researchers wishing to utilize data from the ERCs must develop and submit a study proposal.
- 2. The proposal is reviewed by the staff of the ERC to which it was submitted.
- 3. Feedback on the proposal is given.
- 4. The revised final proposal is forwarded to the ERC Advisory Board for the next ERC Advisory Board meeting.
- 5. If the ERC Advisory Board approves the proposal, researchers are granted access to the Texas ERC data.



ERC Procedures for Data Access (cont.)

- 6. There is required training regarding FERPA and masking small cells through the specific ERC you applied to.
- 7. Researchers gain access to the data and statistical software on the secure server (SAS, Stata, SPSS, R, R-Studio, Python (IDLE), & SQL).
- 8. All output is reviewed for small cells. If approved, the output is released to the researcher.
- 9. When the study is completed, researchers are required to submit a policy brief to summarize their findings.



An Important Component of a Proposal is how the Results will Benefit Education and/or the Workforce in Texas

 A required section of the proposal is benefit to education and/or workforce in Texas. It is very important to discuss benefits and policy relevancy of how results can assist in improving Texas education and/or workforce.
