Launched in June 2023, LONESTARP3 is already breaking new ground in education research—and it's all in the approach. We started with inclusion. Leaders from every education sector across the state formed a working network, which has been recognized for its dynamic and responsive research collaborations. And we never strayed from the target: improved outcomes for all students in Texas.

➤ **The Beginning:** Where Aspiration Became Reality

★ In February 2024, we hosted the first gathering of our community of educators, researchers, and policy advocates to explore the challenges students face as they navigate their path from school to work. Attendees were hungry for this kind of cross-sector collaboration—for hearing new perspectives, for developing deeper understanding, and for getting research into the right hands at the right time. Our members felt a shared sense of connection and purpose.

★ In June 2024, we gathered our members again to distill possibilities into priorities. We emerged united with a shared Pathways Research Agenda organized around four core themes: Academic and Career Advising, Dual Credit Academic and Workforce Education Programs, Workforce-aligned Instruction, and Postsecondary Pursuits



➤ A Statewide Summit: Where Inspiration Grew

175 people from across the state came together for our first public-facing forum—Success Summit—in September 2024. The energy and enthusiasm among members and the broader statewide community was palpable and consensus emerged on the value and need for the Pathways Research Agenda. Commissioner Mike Morath from the TEA, and Deputy Commissioner David Troutman from THECB were featured speakers.

➤ Research Collaboratives: Where Momentum Built Our Collaboratives formed in Fall 2024 and their important work is advancing. Collaborative Leads and their partners have hammered out their research designs and submitted plans and budgets for their work. More than \$1M will be allocated across LONESTARP3 members to advance these studies over the next 15 months, with plans to release their findings statewide in Fall 2026.

➤ Outreach: Where Our Community Deepened

Our engagement built connections, inspiration, and impact as we continue to drive change in the research landscape. LONESTARP3 CONNECT and LONESTARP3 LIVE! were initiated in 2025 and developed a substantial audience. Near-monthly, peer-to-peer CONNECT Virtual sessions doubled in size in less than one year, from 30 to 70 attendees, with select sessions attracting more than 100. CONNECT In-person sessions hosted by our members across the state continued to build understanding and advance network goals.

LONESTARP3 LIVE!—our quarterly livestream interviews—became an exciting forum for engaging unique and influential viewpoints on Texas education. We featured David Troutman of the THECB in January, and Thea Ulrich-Lewis and Kendra Montejos Edwards of the Charles Butt Foundation. Together these two events drew more than 270 viewers.







Statewide Data Council: Where Data is Always #1 We don't want just any data; we want well-structured data. In January 2025, LONESTARP3 launched a Statewide Data Council to offer insights on how to better tool Texas' data to generate insights needed to improve education practice and policy. The 24-member Council brings deep content expertise, spans multiple sectors and geographies, and aligns with our mission to ensure research is timely and actionable.

➤ Organizational Structure: Where Work has Begun

As we mature, we want to become a sustainable, durable organization. We completed a comparative analysis of near-peer organizations in September 2024, and this analysis—along with member feedback—is guiding the development of a revised governance model. We plan to transition to new practices in the 2025–2026 academic year.
