

PILOT/INNOVATE IN THE FIELD – "CHANGE PRACTICE"

Direct investments into education institutions/nonprofits, etc. to support innovations, improvements, or what's already working.

RESEARCH/ EVALUATE

Gather data and learn from investments to know what is and is not working when money is infused.

INFORM POLICY



practice &
data from research/evaluation
to provide evidence to
policymakers and/or advocates.

SUPPORT IMPLEMENTATION

Provide funding and/or social capital for implementing policies/funding (results) of policymaking.

How:

- Coordinate with Texas philanthropy shared learning, elevating implementation and promising practices and coordinated investments in research/advocacy/practice,
- 2. Ongoing coordination with advocates, practitioners and media
- 3. Pool funds to invest in **data** collection/case studies

Trends in Education Philanthropy

System and Data Integration

• Stronger alignment across public education, higher education, and workforce data systems (ex. forthcoming enhanced wage data)

Early Childhood Education

- Developing innovative local models that support braided funding to improve outcomes for students
- Strengthening the ECE workforce
- Increasing access to child care in rural areas or other child care deserts
- Improving access and affordability with a focus on high-quality settings for early learners

Effective Educators

- Strengthening partnerships between preparation programs and LEAs
- Supporting strong implementation of HB
 2's practice-based preparation routes
- Ensuring successful launch of growyour-own models and apprenticeships
- Embedding strong literacy and numeracy practices into educator preparation
- Supporting innovative school staffing models

Postsecondary Education

- Supporting programmatic changes that foster higher rates of credential of value attainment in community colleges
- Exploring models for emergency aid and other approaches to support short-term student need
- Aligning regional workforce demands to postsecondary programming
- Understanding the gaps provided by changes to federal funding and program changes
- Finding opportunities to reengage opportunity youth and those with some credit but no degree/credential into higher education
- Strengthening advising
